

East Coast 8 Days

Day 1 Arrival – New York City

Meet and greet at airport (Baggage Claim Area) then transfer to hotel for rest.

Pick-up services are available for JFK, LGA and EWR airports. Please arrive at EWR (Newark Liberty International Airport) for convenient.

** The New York City night tour (optional)

Start with an experience of the Big Apple bright night lights and encounters the wonderful NYC landmarks in a beautiful night tour. Visit the South Street Seaport enjoy the spectacular views of the NYC bridges at night. Along with Midtown Manhattan, the largest central business district in the world, home to the NYCs tallest and most famous buildings such as the Empire State Building, the Chrysler Building. Tour also visit world famous Rockefeller Center, an art deco marvel covering 11 acres in midtown Manhattan and home to NBC studios, an outdoor ice skating rink (winter), and Prometheus. Lastly, visit Times Square and Broadway, known as the Theater District or the Great White Way.

Day 2 New York City Tour - Philadelphia

Morning, tour begins with New York City tour of the Big Apple. Started with Chinatown; the largest in the United States. Continue to heart of the financial district at Wall Street where the world-famous bronze charging bull is located, the unofficial symbol of the financial district. Afterward, visits Ground Zero, the 911 incident took place. Then drive through downtown NYC to South Street Seaport; a historic landmark that offers dining, museums, and a shopping mall at Pier 17. It also features amazing views of the East River and the Brooklyn Bridge. Then visit the world-famous Empire State Building; a 102-story Art Deco skyscraper, the tallest building in New York City. Up to the 86th floor observatory enjoys the panoramic views from within a glass enclosed pavilion from the surrounding open-air promenade. Visit the United Nations where 192 countries meet to discuss issues like human rights and achieving world peace; Rockefeller Center, home to NBC studios, outdoor skating rink, and the famous Christmas tree which has delighted crowds for over 75 years. Then narrate through Fifth Avenue ranked as one of the most expensive streets in the world. Also encounter the historic and just renovated Intrepid Sea, Air, and Space Museum. Finally visit the "Crossroads of the World" at Times Square. Then process to Philadelphia of Pennsylvania and check in Hotel for rest.

Day 3 Philadelphia - Washington D.C.



This morning, begin with a brief Philadelphia city tour, visit Independence Hall where George Washington was appointed commander in chief of the Continental Army; the Declaration of Independence was adopted in 1776, and the U.S. Constitution was drafted in 1787. Also see the Liberty Bell which has been a symbol of liberty for over 200 years. The bus then continues to the nation's capital; Washington D.C. Upon arrival D.C. visit the Lincoln Memorial, a Greek temple contains a large seated sculpture of Abraham Lincoln and inscriptions of two well-known speeches by Lincoln. Visit the Jefferson Memorial, dedicated to Thomas Jefferson, an American Founding Father and the third president of the United States. National Museum of Natural History, part of the Smithsonian Institution and is the world's finest museum and research complex. The Museum is dedicated to stimulating curiosity, discovery, and learning about the natural world through its unmatched

research, collections, exhibitions, and educational outreach programs. Also see the White House the world's famous building, which is the residence and workplace for the President of the U.S. The Vietnam Veterans

Memorial designed by Maya Ying Lin and honors members of the U.S. armed forces fought in the Vietnam War and died in service or are missing.

Day 4 Washington D.C. - Hershey - Corning Museum of Glass - Niagara Falls



Morning depart from Washington D.C. to Hershey, Pennsylvania, visit the sweetest place in the world; Hershey's Chocolate World. Here, greeted by giant Hershey's characters upon enter this wonderful world of food, shops and entertainment devoted to all things chocolate. Learn how chocolate is made at a special presentation. Next, travel to Corning, New York to visit the Corning Museum of Glass the largest glass museum in the world with more than 45,000 objects from over 3,500 years of glassmaking history. Observe live, narrated glassmaking demonstrations. Afterwards travel to Niagara Falls. The falls are collectively made from the American Falls, Bridal Veil Falls, and the Canadian Horseshoe Falls and are famous for their beauty and as a valuable source of hydroelectric power. In the evening,

the breathtaking views when the intense spotlights shower the falls with different shades of rainbow colors.

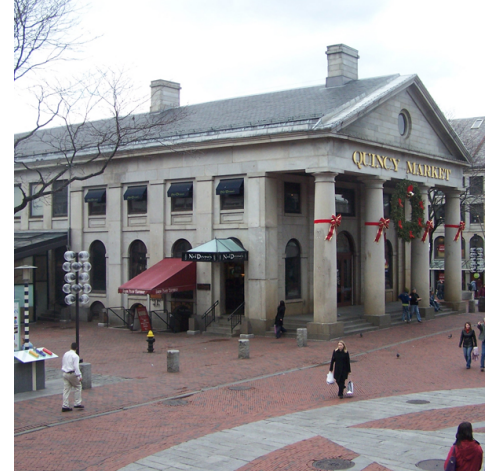
Day 5 Niagara Falls – Boston

Morning visit the spectacular Niagara Falls up close. Day 6 Boston city tour - Rhode Island - Plymouth Rock
Morning begin city tour of Boston with a stop at Harvard University; the oldest university in the United States; Visits Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), a world-class institution in science and technology; The Massachusetts State House, magnificent setting for the state government, over two centuries has become an outstanding museum reflecting the history of Massachusetts since colonial times. Shops and foods at the Faneuil Hall Marketplace, also known as Quincy Market set around a cobblestone promenade where jugglers, magicians and musicians entertain the passers-by. Visit historic Plymouth Rock on the shore of Plymouth Harbor, a world-famous symbol of the courage and faith for men and women who founded the first New England colony. The Mayflower II, a replica of the ship that brought the first Pilgrims to Massachusetts, is also anchored at the park. Then visit the wealthy community of Newport, Rhode Island which is home the Breakers Mansion; the summer home for the Vanderbilt family. The Breakers Mansion is a 70-room mansion that overlooks the Atlantic Ocean and is named for the waves crashing into the rocks below the 13-acre estate.

Day 7 Boston - Yale University - NYC-Chinatown, Little Italy, SoHo
